Shirley had some sleepless nights at the hospital, scared and wondering what was next, knowing that she couldn't return home. The staff at St. Boniface Hospital told Shirley and her family about Jocelyn House and suggested that it would be the right place for her. Shirley said that the news made her feel emotional but they agreed that it felt like the right choice to make.

The first time she came to the hospice was the day she moved in and she said she was so amazed! She wasn't expecting it to be so beautiful and tranquil, and she instantly felt relaxed. Shirley spent her first afternoon at the hospice in the living room. She shared that the nurse tucked her in with pillows and blankets on the couch and she felt so comfortable," like a marshmallow", she remembered with a laugh! As she sat reflecting on her new home, the word that kept coming to her mind was "Serenity"; she was surprised to wake up two hours later refreshed after a restful afternoon nap.

Most of Shirley's days at the hospice are not as quiet as the first. Every day, as she did when she lived on her own, Shirley continues to welcome family and friends for coffee and goodies. It is rare to enter her room and find her alone; her children, grandchildren, siblings, cousins, friends or one of our staff or volunteers is almost always found sharing a story with Shirley.

Shirley's career was centered on customer service and working with the public. Her warm personality is reflective of her kind nature; when you enter her room you are always welcomed with, "Hi, come on in!" Shirley loves interacting with the staff, all of whom she knows by name, and appreciates the personalized care she receives and above all, seeing their smiling faces.

People often say that they think that the hospice is a sad place but Shirley says that can't be further from the truth! The hospice makes her feel safe, welcome, cared for and happy. There can be difficult moments but Shirley knows that a caring member of the team is right outside her door ready to listen or respond to her needs. She is grateful for the peace of mind living at the hospice gives her and her family is too!

Shirley's favourite spot at Jocelyn House is the deck overlooking the back yard. She starts each day savouring a cup of coffee as she watches the deer and squirrels run through the yard and spends the afternoons with visitors as they watch the ducks and canoes float past on the Seine. Shirley says that she enjoys looking out the window as she drifts off to sleep, watching the beautiful oak leaves fall, and her last thought of each day is...this place is something everyone needs.
